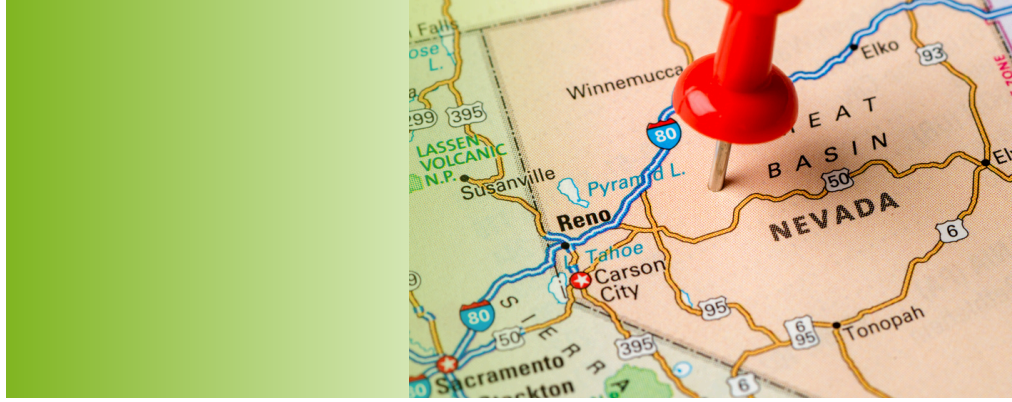


HOW TO Form Your Nevada LLC



01

Choose a Name for Your LLC

Select a unique name that includes "Limited Liability Company," "LLC," or "L.L.C.," and ensure it's available by searching the [Nevada Secretary of State Business Search](#).

02

Appoint a Registered Agent

Designate a registered agent with a physical address in Nevada to accept legal documents on behalf of your LLC; this can be an individual or a professional service.

03

File a Articles of Organization

Submit the Articles of Organization (Form LLC-1) to the Nevada Secretary of State online or by mail with your LLC name, registered agent, and management details; the filing fee is \$425, which includes a business license fee and an initial list of managers/members. File through the [Nevada SilverFlume Business Portal](#).

04

Obtain a Nevada State Business License

A Nevada business license is required for most LLCs and is included in the filing fee for the Articles of Organization; renew it annually for \$200.

05

File an Initial List of Managers or Members

Submit the Initial List of Managers or Members within 30 days of forming your LLC, which is also included in the Articles of Organization filing fee.

06

Draft an Operating Agreement (Optional)

While not legally required, drafting an Operating Agreement is recommended to outline your LLC's ownership, management structure, and operating procedures.

07

Obtain an EIN (Employer Identification Number)

Apply for an EIN through the [IRS website](#) to handle taxes, hire employees, and open a business bank account.

08

Register for State Taxes

If applicable, register your LLC for Nevada state taxes, such as sales tax or payroll tax, with the Nevada Department of Taxation.

09

Comply with Annual Filing Requirements

File an Annual List of Managers or Members and renew your state business license each year to keep your LLC in good standing.
